Dear Friends and Neighbors of Hospice,

Thank you for your continuous generosity and support for our organization. We strive to provide the best care to those facing a life-limiting illness. Thank you all for making our mission possible. Your support directly impacts the patients and families we serve annually. We wanted to take this opportunity to share two of our patients' journeys.

We had the privilege to speak to Renee Meese, daughter of Daniel Schultz. Daniel received hospice care at our Martin-Linsin Residence in August.

"Upon arrival, Stacey, a Martin-Linsin nurse, met us. She did my father's intake and she was awesome. She handled my father with a gentleness I had not seen before. I felt like my dad was

rescued by Martin-Linsin and everyone there played a part."

One of Renee's favorite memories was when her father was asked about his favorite drink. "He managed to whisper Pepsi and wouldn't you know it, not five minutes later we had an ice cold glass of soda in our hands for him which he happily and promptly emptied."

We asked Renee what she would say to other families who may be on the fence about choosing hospice care for their loved one. "Don't be afraid of Hospice. I know so many people think it's only really for the few last days of life but it is also for people who are in their last six months of life. It is a warm, loving environment and I only wish that I have been able to have gotten my father there sooner. I have come across many people who have the misconception that hospice hurries the end of life. That is not true. Hospice and especially the Martin-Linsin Residence was able to allow my father to die peacefully without pain and without being afraid. He sensed he was safe and cared for and I felt the same.



The Martin-Linsin Residence was not a cold institutional-type place like most hospitals and nursing homes. If you can do one thing for your loved one, bring them to this hospice. You won't regret it. Thank you to all the Martin-Linsin Residence staff for helping to walk my dad home."



We also had the opportunity to speak to Marissa Olles, daughter of Meredith Minier. Meredith was a part of our hospice home care program in the Spring. In August, she received hospice care at the Martin-Linsin Residence. Marissa described how her family felt when Meredith first began hospice care at home.

"Much of our comfort and peace came from our talks with Jennelle, mom's home nurse. She is a truly kind, gentle, and competent nurse who spoke softly and encouragingly to us about each aspect of Mom's care."

Marissa also described how prepared her family

felt before Meredith transitioned from care at home to our Martin-Linsin Residence. "That measure of preparedness ensured that when the day came that Mom entered the Hospice residence, I never had to lift a finger to fill out a form, find insurance cards, etc. We could simply spend precious time together."

We asked Marissa what she would say to other families who may be in a similar situation with their loved one but aren't sure if hospice is the right next step.

"Taking care of a beloved family member or friend is one of the most stressful experiences we face. It's emotionally and physically overwhelming and making the right decisions on behalf of that loved one can be nerve-racking. As hard as it is for the caretaker, the loved one is facing the biggest challenge of all. The decision to accept and fully utilize hospice services is one of the best decisions we made with Mom. I wish everyone could understand how much it benefited our family. We had absolutely no regrets. When you love someone, they deserve the best care you can possibly provide, and hospice was the answer for us."

As you carefully consider your Fall/Winter gift, please know that your generosity provides comfort to the patients and families we serve. Without you, we would not have had the opportunity to provide Daniel, Meredith, and their families with a beautiful ending.
